

## THE FARM AS AN IDEA: PROTECTION FROM WAR

The farm lane ran into the Clifton - Library road, which is marked as part of the Orange Belt. These color designated Belts persist today. They were originally devised to move people away from Pittsburgh in case of an air strike. Before air pollution controls, major steel mills line the Monongehela, Allegheny, and Ohio Rivers. Because of their importance in the war, Pittsburgh was regarded as a prime target for enemy bombs. It was anticipated that the strike would occur at night. A home in the dark countryside, with hills between home and the mills was a key defense strategy.
